Teacher	1. Complete and turn in the Utah questions.
Teacher	2. Earn your Cursive License. (See your teacher for details.)
Teacher	3. Independent Reading - read at least 400 minutes a month for 7 months.
Teacher	4. Pass off multiplication math facts. (See your teacher for details.)
Teacher	5. 80% or higher on 4 math tests.
Teacher	6. 90% or higher on 20 spelling tests.
Teacher	7. Participate in one school-wide event (Science Fair, School Carnival, Dr. Seuss Day, STEM day, attend both Parent-Teacher Conferences, etc.).
Teacher	8. Memorize and label Utah's 29 Counties on a map.
Teacher	9. Complete a Teacher's Choice assignment. (See your teacher for details.)
Teacher	10. Earn all E's or S's on Work and Social Skills on the first two report cards.
Parent	11. Plan and carry out a family activity, outing, project, lesson, etc. Write a reflection (at least one paragraph). Please include the type of activity, who attended, what you planned, how it went, etc.
Parent	12. Perform 4 or more hours of student-chosen service done outside of the home. Does not include chores or paid services. Please turn in a written or visual report on type of service, dates of service, reflection, etc.
Parent	13. Read at least 10 different books for the 4th Grade Read-O Chart.

Parent	14. Complete a family tree for at least three generations OR research a distant relative and write a two paragraph life biography.
Parent	15. Choose an authentic cultural restaurant or recipe that you have never tried before. Take pictures of you and your food. Write two paragraphs describing your experience and what you learned about that culture. What culture did you choose? What restaurant did you go to? What recipe did you cook? Did you use or eat any new spices or ingredients? Did you like the food? Would you recommend it?
Parent	16. Try a new hobby, sport, or skill. Practice it for at least 4 weeks. Afterwards, write a three paragraph reflective essay about your experience (i.e. What did you do? Things learned? Will you continue, why or why not.).
Parent	17. Visit a Utah Historical Site or National Park. (In person or virtually) Write a two paragraph essay about your experience. Write about the place you went, where it's located in Utah, what you did there, what you learned about Utah history, etc. Try to include pictures if you can.
Parent	18. Complete a report on something Utah related (environment, mountain man, pioneer, famous Utahn, current event, etc.). Prepare a 3-5 minute oral presentation with a visual aid (poster, PowerPoint, diorama, a book, etc.).
Parent	19. Enter the PTA Reflections contest, due by October 1, 2021. The theme is "I Will Change the World By...". To enter the reflections contest, go to utahpta.org/ref
Parent	20. Write and mail/deliver at least 4 letters to family members who do not live with you: military veterans, first responders, pen pals, etc.
